Dear Westminster Friends,

As I'm sure it does with you, Christmas reminds me of my past. My memories of Christmases from different eras in my life are as vivid as my memories of this morning. I remember receiving Lincoln Logs as a gift from Santa for my fifth Christmas, and wondering why my oldest brother got the cooler Erector Set, with the working crane. I remember the year I received a hockey game as a gift, and beating my dad at the game...and his not being too happy about it. I recall the Christmas my brother came home from the Army, my first Christmas with Bonnie as my wife, our first Christmases with each of our children, and each of our new Labrador Retrievers. Christmas, it seems, is tailor-made to keep us focused on the past.

But the event behind our holiday celebrations is not intended to keep our hearts and minds in yesteryear. Indeed, while the nativity of the incarnate Son of God calls us to remember God's keeping His promises, His arrival was intended to point toward something in His, and our, future. Jesus' coming as an infant to Bethlehem was for the purpose of leaving behind the manger and pursuing Jerusalem and the cross thirty-some years later. God, it seems, always seems to be aiming at something in the future. The cross and the empty tomb were the culmination of what began decades, even millennia, earlier, in the heart and will of our Father. God is always looking toward the future, and calls us to do the same.

Our temptation, as always, is to think of what is behind us as being better than what lies ahead. I believe that this is true for the simple reason that the past is something that we can truly know and understand to some extent, while the future is incredibly mysterious and, therefore, frightening. What we cannot know for certain causes us anxiety and fear, while what we remember, even if not perfect, can be lived again in our minds, causing warmth, familiarity, and a desire to return. But, again, that is not God's way of operating... and if we trust Him, it should not be ours.

As we move past this Christmas and into a new year, I will be sharing my vision for what is ahead, at least as much as I can understand from the Holy Spirit. We know that we have had good years in the past, but I believe that we have better, more faithful and productive years ahead of us. It won't be easy, and it may tend to cause us some anxiety, but if the Lord is in it, something much better than we can ever remember is on its way.

But until then, let's feel free to revel in our memories of Christmases past, knowing that Jesus holds in His strong and loving hands all of our Christmases yet to come.

Report from the Meeting of Great Lakes Presbytery

October 20-21, 2017

The churches of Great Lakes Presbytery (Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, and Wisconsin) met at Calvary Presbyterian Church in Logansport, Indiana on October 20-21. Pastor Chuck and Elder Jason Drury were Westminster's delegates to this important and busy gathering.

Our worship was wonderful, including communion on Friday night, served by the presbytery council, and our keynote speaker, Becky Lahna, did a great job of challenging us to rethink the ways we share our faith. One of ECO's church planters, she clearly demonstrated that the ways in which we used to witness and do evangelism — inviting people to events at the church — no longer work with more than 50% of our population, particularly those born after 1984. We were challenged to grow our churches by growing new disciples of Jesus, which is the way it should always be!

Along with the inspiration and training, some very important business was done at the meeting, including:

- ◆ Sending an overture to the National Gathering in January that will clearly define the content of ECO's Book of Confessions
- ◆ Requesting that the Synod (our national body), allow our current presbytery to multiply into two presbyteries, creating a brand new regional body, to be known as the Presbytery of the Harvest. Along with churches in Wisconsin and Indiana, the churches in Illinois, including Westminster, will be a part of this new presbytery
- ◆ Electing officers for each of the two presbyteries as they come into being in January, 2018. Those who will be serving in the new Presbytery of the Harvest are Pastor Chuck (as the Chair of the Ministry Partnership team), Susanne Fuller (as the Treasurer), and Al Machuca (as a member of the Missional Affinity Group Team).

If you have questions about the meeting, or if you would like to talk about how you can be a part of the different teams that will make up the new presbytery, we encourage you to talk with either Pastor Chuck or Jason Drury.

It would be so nice if you would join the Tuesday morning prayer team, but if you cannot, then please be sure to pray for our church throughout the week as the Holy Spirit leads you. More about the Lord's Prayer from Haddon W. Robinson's *Jesus' Blueprint for Prayer*. We've been reminded of the first part of the prayer of Jesus and now it's time to look at the next two phrases: Your kingdom come, Your will be done.

"The second request that we direct to the Father *about the Father* is devoted to the person of God and to the program of God. We look toward that glad time when God's messianic kingdom prophesied throughout the Old Testament will be established by Jesus' return to earth. We look forward to the climax of history when God's will shall be done on earth as it is in heaven. Nothing should take precedence over His coming. And that is as it should be in all of our lives. That is what it means to pray 'Your kingdom come.'" (emphasis mine).

Now what about 'Your will be done'? "We are to pray for the person of God, that His name be hallowed; for the program of God, that His kingdom will come; and for the purpose of God, that His will be accomplished on earth as it is in heaven. Praying for His will to be done provides a foundation for our prayers. We are basically asking that God's will be done in our lives and in the world. We must recognize the importance of conforming our will to His will. Prayer is not getting God to do *my will*; it is asking that God's will be done in my life, my family, my business, and in my relationships, as it is done in heaven." (emphasis mine)

We will celebrate the birth of Jesus with a concert full of beautiful Christmas music, including many Christmas Carols.
