Dear Westminster Friends,

Last month I introduced another necessary—and needed—component to our practice of the faith: the need for intentional and consistent fellowship with one another. And as I introduced the subject, I mentioned the two vital components of biblical fellowship: a commitment to be present and a commitment to communication. I will expand upon those two commitments this month.

There is no lasting and growing fellowship with one another, and therefore no well-rounded discipleship, if we are not physically present with one another. We practice this in general in our everyday lives. We are not truly employees of a company if we do not work alongside one another, even if it is virtual in nature. If we are students and we never go to class, something big is lost. If we are part of a family, but we never spend time together, then what kind of family are we?

The simple truth is that we have to be together—seeing, hearing, interacting—in order for our relationships to grow in healthy ways. There are numerous ways we can devote ourselves to this: being in worship every week, being a part of a Life Group, attending fellowship events, and taking it upon ourselves to develop relationships beyond what is programmed, by inviting one another into our homes and lives. And it is incumbent upon us to make sure that we extend that fellowship to those who cannot be physically present with us due to various life circumstances—we must call upon and visit with them!

There is also no true fellowship without communication. If we gather together but do not listen or speak to each other, what has been accomplished? Maybe we have enjoyed some good food and a little laughter, but our friendships have not deepened. We must be intentional in making every time we are together an opportunity to talk with each other, to share and listen to the joys and pains of our lives, so that we can know each other better and care for each other in loving ways.

This might mean that, when we come to church for worship, we come earlier and plan to stay later, just so we can talk to one another. In our fellowship events, we need to build in time to learn from one another, and in our Life Groups and Sunday school classes, we need to not just have a great lesson, but to form ourselves around a meal or around a need so that we can get to the heart of things. Most of all, when we do so, we need to learn how to both listen actively to each other, and to speak honestly with each other. Only then will our relationships grow like those we see in the Bible, and for which our hearts truly long.

2019 National Gathering Report

ECO met at the First Presbyterian Church of Colorado Springs for its 2019 National Gathering, from Monday, January 28 through Thursday, January 31.

Monday the 28th provided something new for just ECO pastors and their spouses. Will Mancini, the head of Auxano—an ECO partner to assist with leadership development—provided tools and encouragement for pastors and their spouses. Meals and a talent show were also part of this special time for church leaders.

From Tuesday the 29th through Thursday the 31st, the National Gathering met around the theme of “Locally Grown: Cultivating Your Next Flourishing Step.” The theme is taken from Jeremiah 29, where God encourages His people to think about what they will plant and grow, even though they are in exile from their homeland.

Plenary Sessions included a number of speakers on the theme and how it applies to vision, mission, and ministry. ECO synod executive Dana Allin shared an updated set of goals for ECO to pursue over the next 10 years. Nicole Martin energized and encouraged us to consider how God might be calling us to something outside of our comfort zone. Nate Stratman shared the story of his church plant, which has become something they never imagined. These and other main speakers were recorded and you are encouraged to go to the ECO website (www.eco-pres.org) and watch the videos.

Breakout groups were offered in three sessions, and covered everything from witnessing to Muslim neighbors to retirement planning, from creativity in worship to writing curriculum for small groups, and from stewardship to theology.

- 3 The 2020 National Gathering and Synod Business Meeting will be on February 4 through 6 at the Gaylord-Texan Resort and Convention Center in Grapevine (Dallas), Texas. Anyone from any ECO church is welcome to register and attend.

Twenty members of the Westminster small groups and other members of the congregation recently volunteered packing dry food items at FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN in Aurora. Teams of five volunteers measured and packed dry food ingredients in packets and placed them in boxes of 36-packets. Our team of volunteers was able to pack twenty-five boxes that will be shipped to Haiti providing nourishment for 14,000 meals, or feeding 15 children one meal each day for a year.

Team members indicated they look forward to sponsoring this event again later in the year and inviting others to participate.

Last month, I showcased **Maggie Ayers**, our **LIFE Group #7 Leader**. If you haven't already met **Maggie**, please introduce yourself. Although she would love to have you as a part of **LIFE Group #7**, Maggie will not hold you hostage in the sanctuary until you say "Yes". I promise. **Maggie** is a vivacious Covenant Partner you need to know.

Additional people you need to know are the other six **LIFE Group Leaders**. This month I am going to showcase **Bonnie Legvold, Gary Gapinske and Lou Jacobs**. When you encounter these covenant partners, please thank them for their discipleship as a **LIFE Group Leader**. Everyone likes to know they are appreciated now and then.

A bit ago, I asked the **LIFE Group Leaders** to answer four questions they knew would be in an upcoming newsletter. Following are the questions along with responses from **Bonnie, Gary and Lou**.

How has leading a LIFE Group helped you to grow spiritually?



Bonnie: A big part of **LIFE Groups** is accountability. Leading a group has made me accountable to the other members in the group by trying to meet their needs through study and fellowship, as well as being accountable to God for correctly interpreting and teaching His word.



Gary: Leading a **LIFE Group** has helped me to grow spiritually by making me put the time and effort into studying something that I wouldn't have otherwise studied. It's also given me insight into the thoughts and ideas of other members of our group.



Lou: Preparing for a **LIFE Group** session always involves getting into and studying the Word, even if only small segments. New insights are always obtained with each opportunity. The more one leads a group, the more comfortable it is; probably with the help of the Holy Spirit.

What new relationship/s have you developed as a result of leading your group?

Bonnie: When our group first started to meet, I only knew two of the members. The others I had only spoken with at church. Since then, I consider all these people to be my friends. We have shared laughter, meals, study, prayer and problems. We check in on each other and provide service to each other when needed.

Gary: We know each other's backgrounds more and more and understand the origins of varying beliefs. We've grown in this area even though most of our group members have known each other for years.

Lou: Ten people have now developed close and caring relationships with each other.

How is your life different now that you are regularly participating in a LIFE Group?

Bonnie: Being the pastor's wife, it is difficult to develop deep relationships within the church. My **LIFE Group** provides these deep relationships. It also allows me to minister to others on a deeper level.

Gary: I feel a responsibility toward our group, though I would like for others to have the opportunity to lead the study sometimes. I am thankful that others do take leadership roles in planning, logistics, etc.

Lou: For me, having led groups before; my life isn't all that different. Now, however, I have eight more really close friends.

What would you say to someone who is hesitating or has "closed the door" about joining a LIFE Group?

Bonnie: If you refuse to become a member of a **LIFE Group**, you are missing a blessing. You are also missing opportunities. As Christians, we are designed to be in deep fellowship with each other and to minister to each other. This is not possible if we only attend church and see each other once a week. We need smaller groups of believers to develop our ministry skills and to have our own needs met. Just do it!! You will be glad you did.

Gary: If you are putting off joining a group, I would simply say, "Try it. You'll like it." I've heard several people say that is exactly what happened to them. What started out as something they dreaded has become something they look forward to.

Lou: Don't wait. Being in a group is a great experience and has been important for us in getting connected in various churches over the years.

In the meantime, find **Maggie** at church and tell her you would like to have more information about **LIFE Group #7**. Asking for more information is not a commitment. A commitment will come when Jesus touches your heart and tells you the time is right for you to be in **LIFE Group #7**.


The book for this month is **We Were the Lucky Ones** by Georgia Hunter.

Inspired by the incredible true story of one Jewish family separated at the start of World War II, determined to survive—and to reunite—We Were the Lucky Ones is a tribute to the triumph of hope and love against all odds.

It is the spring of 1939 and three generations of the Kurc family are doing their best to live normal lives, even as the shadow of war grows closer. The talk around the family Seder table is of new babies and budding romance, not of the increasing hardships threatening Jews in their hometown of Radom, Poland. But soon the horrors overtaking Europe will become inescapable and the Kurcs will be flung to the far corners of the world, each desperately trying to navigate his or her own path to safety.

As one sibling is forced into exile, another attempts to flee the continent, while others struggle to escape certain death, either by working grueling hours on empty stomachs in the factories of the ghetto or by hiding as gentiles in plain sight. Driven by an unwavering will to survive and by the fear that they may never see one another again, the Kurcs must rely on hope, ingenuity, and inner strength to persevere.

An extraordinary, propulsive novel, *We Were the Lucky Ones* demonstrates how in the face of the twentieth century's darkest moment, the human spirit can endure and even thrive.
