## MONTHLY NEWS FOR AND ABOUT OUR CONGREGATION

Dear Westminster Friends,

As we continue to rediscover the importance of great discipleship practices, we come to the practice of prayer. Prayer is one of the most often-practiced disciplines, yet it remains, for many people, ineffective and poorly-understood. We need to learn how to "up our game" when it comes to prayer.

At its heart, prayer is conversation between us and the Living God, and if it is a conversation, it requires that we both speak and listen. Speaking and listening are required aspects of a good prayer life, as well as a good relationship. So much of what we often do in our individual prayer lives, though, is more informing than speaking, and more getting on with life than listening. We need desperately to correct both our understanding and our practice of prayer.

When we speak to God, we must begin with an understanding of exactly to whom we are speaking. God is no customer service representative on the phone, or cashier at the store, nor is He an employee of our faith or a servant for our whims. God is not in relationship with us so that we can tell Him what to do and when to do it. He is with us for the purpose of walking with us through life.

The simple acknowledgement or remembrance of His person and character will certainly change how we approach Him, and what we say to Him when we speak.

In speaking to God in prayer, our goal should be to speak with Him, rather than just to Him. To do so means that we need to spend time with Him, speaking at length with the One who is our Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer in life. If our best friend is sitting at the table with us, none of us would just ramble off a grocery list of what's bugging us and then get up and leave. We dare not just dump our list of gripes, complaints, and needs in His lap and then walk away. We need to take the time to speak with Him at length, getting to the heart of what is on our hearts. We can't do that when we only shout at Him in passing.

Speaking to God in prayer also demands that we don't do it on some hit-and-miss basis, but that we are intentional and disciplined to do it regularly. In the same way that good marriages are built on intentional, regular time in conversation between husbands and wives, so our relationship with God will deepen and mature when we make time for those prayerful conversations to take place on a regular, even scheduled, basis.

So that's the first part of the discipline of prayer—speaking. Next month, I'll be prepared to share with you about how we develop good listening habits.

Any covenant partner is encouraged to discuss any of these, or other, matters with one of the elders.

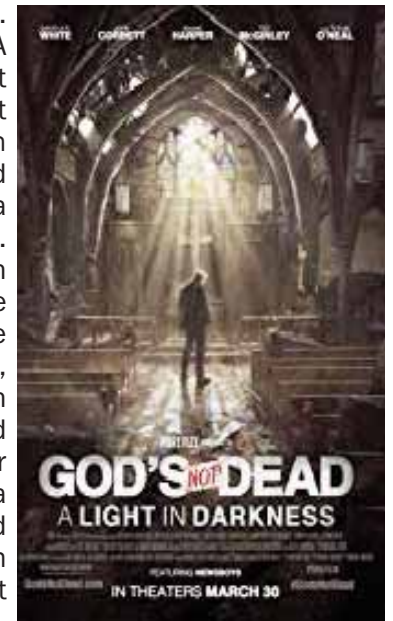

## Finding the Way Home

Sometimes this journey through life can be so difficult that we're simply overwhelmed, and it seems there's no end to the darkness. During such a time in our own family's life, my wife emerged one morning from her quiet time with a new lesson learned. "I think God wants us not to forget in the light what we're learning in this darkness."

Paul writes this same thought to the Corinthians (2 Corinthians 1), after describing the terrible difficulties he and his team endured in Asia. Paul wants the Corinthians to understand how God can redeem even our darkest moments. We're comforted, he says, so we may learn how to comfort others. Paul and his team were learning things from God during their trials that they could use to comfort and advise the Corinthians when they faced similar difficulties. And God does that for us as well, if we're willing to listen. He will redeem our trials by teaching us how to use what we've learned in them to minister to others.

Are you in the darkness now? Be encouraged by Paul's words and experience. Trust that God is right now directing your steps and that He's also stamping His truths on your heart so you can share them with others who are in similar circumstances. You've been there before, and you will know the way home.

Three more individuals you need to know are **Jason Drury, Tom Westerfield** and **John Halsey**, who complete the team of **LIFE Group Leaders**. Please extend gratitude to these three disciples of Jesus whenever you see them. A kind written note of gratitude for their service would also be appreciated, I'm sure.

Following are the four questions/answers I requested of **Jason, Tom** and **John** last February.

### How has leading a LIFE Group helped you to grow spiritually?



**Jason:** Our group trusts me to seek out topics that interest them. I sincerely ask often what is on their hearts.

I listen to them and create studies to help them with their struggles. I'm sometimes able to offer a different perspective that maybe they haven't thought of, and they equally challenge me with new perspectives. I get to spend hours preparing studies and topics by researching God's word. How could I not grow spiritually?!



**Tom:** Leading is much different than being in a group. Sometimes the "administrivia" of scheduling, contacting and

preparing the physical space seem overwhelming. Lesson preparation is helping me to go deeper, but still sometimes seems like a burden more than growth; although I know that time spent in the Word is never wasted.



**John:** Preparing has proven to be an excellent way to study and to evaluate my own growth.

### What new relationship/s have you developed as a result of leading your group?

**Jason:** We have been together now over 2 years. We know a lot about each other that may not have been common knowledge. We've discussed our failures and our fears. We've discussed our hopes and our joys. I find myself seeking the other group members when I cannot settle my heart. They have given me an inner circle for my spiritual growth.

**Tom:** I have gotten to know two people with whom I had not previously been acquainted. The group has shared in the tragedies and triumphs (like surviving January and February!) of our lives.

**John:** We all are getting to know new people in a new way.

### How is your life different now that you are regularly participating in a LIFE Group?

**Jason:** I'm excited about midweek opportunities to praise and worship

God. I think to myself often how blessed are the churches that offer midweek worship. Our **LIFE Group** offers this whole other night to get lost with God. I believe all of our **LIFE Group** members are different today because of each other. We are stronger in hospitality, stronger in healthy bonds, stronger in our discipleship of other people, we communicate better, and we witness better.

**John:** I'm more focused on the group, the people, and the program, checking our progress.

**Tom:** At least now I vacuum the house weekly! I've been immersed with WPC's attempts to nourish small group ministry for YEARS. It's encouraging to see this finally beginning to bear fruit.

### What would you say to someone who is hesitating or has "closed the door" about joining a LIFE Group?

**Jason:** All of us need other people to help us on our path of discipleship. All of us need accountability in our lives and challenges to keep us focused. Why would you not seek an extra opportunity to be in the presence of God and to enjoy fellowship with God's children?

**John:** Be anxious to join, working on fellowship and spiritual growth.

**Tom:** I'm sorry for your loss. I mean that both literally and figuratively. I can appreciate that there may be fear of the vulnerability that being in a smaller group can expose (There's no place to hide.). If a person has

an active life, one more thing may be one thing too much; but I would encourage, beg, cajole, whatever it takes to get a person to take the plunge. Beware! It will be transforming!

On Saturday, May 4, the **LIFE Group Ministry** team will be meeting to plan one summer activity that will include LIFE Group members in all seven groups and one summer activity that will involve all covenant members of Westminster Presbyterian Church. So far, Maggie Ayers is the only member of Life Group #7. If you are a person who comes to church on Sunday, leaves for the week and then comes back the following Sunday, please open your heart to joining LIFE Group #7. You will not regret this decision.

## WPC BOOK CLUB

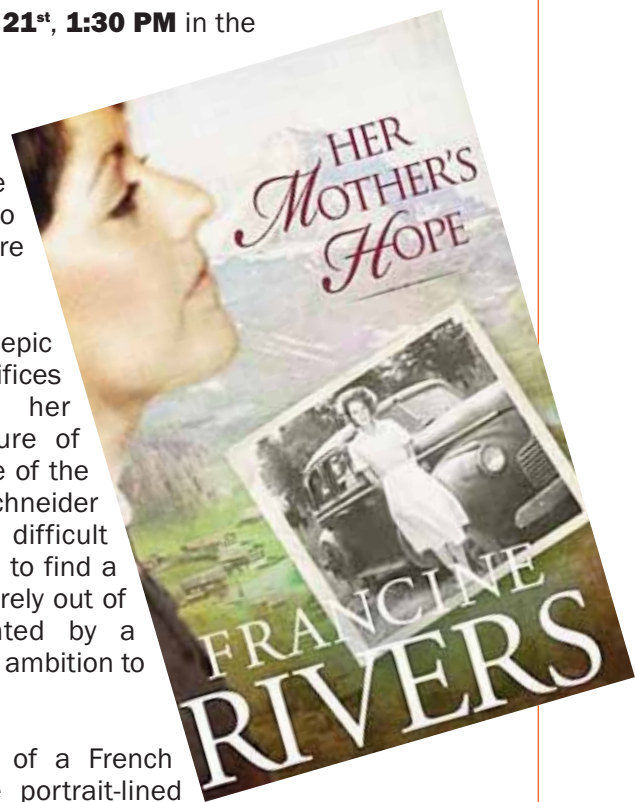
WPC Book Club Tuesday, **May 21<sup>st</sup>, 1:30 PM** in the West Conference Room.

The book for this month is *Her Mother's Hope* by Francine Rivers. Copies of the book are available in the church office to be signed out to read before May 21<sup>st</sup>.

The first part of unforgettable epic family saga about the sacrifices every mother makes for her daughter and the very nature of unconditional love. On the eve of the First World War, fiery Marta Schneider leaves Switzerland and her difficult childhood behind, determined to find a new life on her own terms. Barely out of her teens, Marta is haunted by a devastating loss that fuels her ambition to one day own a hotel.

From the cramped quarters of a French housekeeping school to the portrait-lined halls of a stately English manor, Marta becomes a hard working domestic who has little time to dwell on what might have been. Instead, she draws her strength from what could be. Then, Marta meets Niclas Waltert, a man just as determined as she to forge a better life in a new place. Niclas captures her heart and together they endure the harshness of life as tenant farmers on the vast prairies of Winnipeg, Canada, before following the promise of the American dream and migrating to the agriculturally rich Central Valley of California. Marriage and motherhood bring both joy and heartbreak, as Marta must surrender her long-held ambitions for the sake of her husband and children, including her daughter, Hildemara, upon whose shoulders her own hopes now squarely rest. Only the strong survive and Marta is determined to raise a daughter as strong as she. But as Hildie reaches young womanhood and another war is fast approaching, those hopes become too heavy a burden for Hildie to bear. Born with a heart to serve others, Hildie pursues her calling as a nurse, something Marta can't understand. Marta's years of hardnosed parenting have left Hildie still hungry for her mother's love...and now for her mother's respect. Amid the drama of WWII, Hildie falls in love and begins a family of her own. She wants her daughter, Carolyn, never to doubt her love—but the challenges of life conspire against her vow and the only person who can come to her aid is the person she remains so desperate to please: Marta, her mother. With hallmark touches of brilliant prose and gripping characterizations,

*Her Mother's Hope* is a rich, moving epic about faith and dreams, heartache and disappointment, and ultimately the resilience and tenacity of love.

This concept is nothing new, in fact it has a long rich history:

**1775** First recorded national call to Fasting and Prayer by the Continental Congress.

**1863** President Lincoln declares a National Day of Prayer and Fasting.

**1983** National Day of Prayer Task Force established in May. First observance was held in Constitution Hall.

**1987** National Prayer committee lobbies President Reagan and Congress to designate a day for national prayer.

**1988** President Reagan signs into law the first Thursday in May as the annual observance of the National Day of Prayer.

**1991** Shirley Dobson becomes the chair of the National Day of Prayer Task Force.

**2016** Shirley Dobson passes the chair over to Anne Graham Lotz who becomes the interim chair.

**2017** National Day of Prayer Board of Directors appoint Dr. Ronnie Floyd as President.

**2018** May 3 will celebrate the 30th anniversary of President Reagan signing into law the designation of the National Day of Prayer.

**Mission Statement:** The mission of the NDP Task Force is to mobilize unified public prayer for America. Since 1993 there have been 1412 proclamations by the President of the US and state leaders encouraging Americans to pray on the National Day of Prayer.
